While studying in the UK, 1989-92, he took Gamelan lessons with Dr. Alec Roth and Cambodia music knowledge with Master Mongkol Um. He was granted permission by the Luang Pradithphairoh Music Foundation to study the ceremonial music Phleng Naaphat Wai Kru in 2004 and 2017.
