

## ACCESSIONS TO THE LIBRARY.

From the Institut Océanographique de l'Indochine, the Library of the T. R. S. has recently received :

1) —36th Note—Note on some new fishes little known to the fresh waters of Cambodia. This note by Jean Durand was published on the 30th January 1940, by Station Maritime de Cauda at Nhatrang. It is a small in-octavo of 40 pages, with 7 plates of different kinds of fishes and 1 map in black.

2) —37th Note—Concerning the fat taken from the fish known as *Calin Bank* or *Thynnichthys thynnoides Bleeker*. This note, is a small in-octavo work, published at Nhatrang by Station Maritime de Cauda on the 1st July 1940, containing 27 pages only. The author is Henri Marcelet.

3) —38th Note—This note is an exhaustive study of all kinds of Indochinese tortoises, by René Bourret and F. Le Poulain. It was published by the Station Maritime de Cauda, Nhatrang, in June 1941. It is an in-octavo volume of 235 pages, with 11 sketches in black, 48 plates in black and 8 full page plates in colours.

4) —39th Note—Published by Station Maritime de Cauda, Nhatrang, on the 15th June 1942, is a brief resumé of all the activities of the Cooperative Society of the Fisheries in Cambodia, by F. Le Poulain. It is a small in-octavo of 20 pages with 1 map in black and 4 phototypies in black.

5) —40th Note—Concerns the *Sipunculians d'Indochine* by Pierre Leroy. This note was published by the Station Maritime de Cauda, Nhatrang, on the 1st July 1942. The booklet is in-octavo of 51 pages, 5 plates in black and 1 map.

6) —41st Note—Published by the Station Maritime de Cauda, Nhatrang (no date), is a medical study concerning the morphology of the

blood of some fishes, by Jean Durand. This in-octavo book contains 62 pages and 3 coloured plates on art paper.

The Library has also acquired: *Travels in the East* of Nicholas II, Emperor of Russia, when Casarewitch. Two large infolio volumes with about 500 illustrations engraved on wood and numerous heliogravure plates. *Travels in the East* was written by order of H. I. M. by Prince Ookhtomsky, translated from the Russian by Robert Goodlet and edited by Sir George Birdwood.

In volume II, about 62 pages are devoted to the visit to this country, with many interesting illustrations including a portrait of H. M. King Chulalongkorn at the age of 40. This work was printed in London in 1896-1900 by Archibald Constable & Co., Ltd.
