The Journal of Oriental Studies, founded in 1954, is published twice yearly, in January and July, by the Hong Kong University Press on behalf of the Centre of Asian Studies of the University. All manuscripts, books for review and editorial communications should be submitted to the Editors, *Journal of Oriental Studies*, Centre of Asian Studies, University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong.

The area of coverage of the *Journal* includes China, Japan, Korea and Southeast Asia; the subject matter, history, geography, fine arts, language, literature, philosophy, architecture, archaeology, economics, political science, sociology, and anthropology. The Journal will normally be published in English and Chinese, but the Editors will be pleased to consider contributions in other languages. Articles in languages other than English must be accompanied by an abstract in English. Manuscripts not in Chinese must be typed in double spacing on single sides of quarto paper, and should be accompanied by a brief biographical note about the author. Footnotes should appear at the end of typescript articles. Contributors receive 25 offprints of their articles.

The annual subscription to the *Journal* is HK\$60. Single issues are sold for HK\$30. Subscriptions and business correspondence should be addressed to the Hong Kong University Press, University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong.
