SIAMESE-ENGLISH-FRENCH-DICTIONARY.

The Council has approved of a commencement being made with the compilation of a Siamese-English-French dictionary. A Sub-Committee with power to co-opt, has been appointed and this Sub-Committee has commenced work. The Sub-Committee is at present constituted as follows:—Prof. G. Cœdès (President) Chairman, H. H. Prince Dhani, Mr. J. Burnay, Phya Indra Montri, Major Erik Seidenfaden, Mr. R. S. le May, H. H. Prince Bidyalankarana. Luang Thurakich, Luang Pramonda and the Rev. Bro. Hilaire. H. H. Prince Dhani has offered to take steps to obtain if possible some financial assistance and general co-operation from the Government, H. R. H, Prince Damrong has very kindly agreed to allow the staff at the Royal Institute to assist in the preparatory work on the dictionary, and the Sub-Committee has received from the Ministry of Public Instruction a copy of the Padānukrom.
