NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS TO THE NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

The Bulletin publishes articles by anyone on natural history, ecology, systematics, evolution, geology, conservation or natural resource management of relevance to Thailand or Southeast Asia.

Manuscripts should be typewritten neatly, double-spaced, on one side of ordinary paper 8 x 11 inches or similar size. Send the original plus one clear photocopy for review. The style should generally conform to that of articles printed in a recent issue of the Bulletin. The first page should contain the title of the article, authors' names, a brief abstract and the authors' addresses. Leave 1-inch margins for editorial comment. Do not underline any titles or words except scientific names. Each table should be typed on a separate page, with a legend at the top as in the printed Bulletin. Legends for figures should be typed in order on a separate sheet.

Figures should be drawn and lettered neatly in India ink and submitted in the original or as clear photographic copies. Black and white photographs are accepted and should be printed on glossy paper with good contrast. All figures, including photographs, should be numbered and have the authors' names on the back. Color photographs can also be printed if color adds important information; the original film positive (slide) is required.

The editors reserve the right to alter manuscripts in the interests of clarity, brevity and proper English usage. Manuscripts are usually sent to outside reviewers for comments. Manuscripts requiring significant changes will be returned to the authors for revision. Time permitting, the editors are willing to help authors improve their organisation or writing if needed, if the articles otherwise have merit.

Printing costs are generally not charged to authors except for long articles exceeding 25 manuscript pages or more than four plates of photographs. These may be charged to authors at current printing costs.

Authors will receive 30 offprints free of charge (joint authors must divide theirs between them). Extra offprints may be ordered.

Articles may be submitted through any of the editors: see addresses in front of Bulletin.
